A year has passed since the release of the groundbreaking Attorney Impairment Study published by the *Journal of Addiction Medicine*. This study was a joint project of the ABA Commission on Lawyer Assistance Programs and the Hazelden Betty Ford Foundation and is the first time that a study of this type has been conducted on a national basis. The study shows that while the substance use numbers are just slightly higher than those reported in previous localized studies, the mental health statistics are considerably greater. What have we learned, how has the profession adapted and what are our opportunities?
